WHERE ARE THEY IN FENNY? WINNERS AND ANSWERS

The correct answers were as follows:



1. This is the top floor of New City Heating showroom in Watling Street. It was, for a time the home of Fenny Stratford Urban District Council.



2. Mucky Pups is the dog grooming service at the corner of George Street and Victoria Road.



3. This one is a bit of a snare as it is not in its original position. Although it obviously relates to a bridge over the canal, it is now on the wall of the old pumphouse at Fenny Lock. It also caused some problems judging the entries. One entrant, who would otherwise have had a full set of correct answers, identified it as 'Grand Union Canal'. However, it would have been unfair to regard this as a completely correct answer when some people had said, correctly, that it was on the pumphouse and others had, wrongly, ascribed it to various canal bridges.



4. The Small Shop is in Church Street, towards the Victoria Road end.



5. This old water trough for horses is outside the 'Bill and Butcher' public house in Aylesbury Street.



6. Houses in Watling Street. The one on the left is the Red House. It was built in the early 19th Century and at one time incorporated a doctor's surgery. The name 'Red House' was retained when the practice moved to Queensway, notwithstanding that it is now in a light cream building!



7. This is Hill View Terrace, in Victoria Road, opposite the old telephone exchange.



8. This is not a bus shelter! It is on the shelter on the platform at Fenny Stratford Station.



9. This stone is on the Tecton Centre in Church Street. The building was originally the Salvation Army Citadel and the commemorative plaque was laid by Commandant H H Booth. Herbert Booth was a son of the founder for the movement. Later, he worked in Canada and Australia promoting the Salvation Army.



10. The clock and butterfly are on the wall of Lock view cottages, by Fenny Lock.
